Innate vs. Learned


- ▶ Innate
 - ▶ Those that an animal has upon birth
 - ▶ Instinctive
 - ▶ Done correctly the first time
 - ▶ Reflexes, migration, circadian rhythm
- ▶ Learned
 - ▶ Taught by parent
 - ▶ Learned by experiment or experience
 - ▶ Habituation, classical conditioning
 - ▶ Tornado siren, dog coming for food when bell rings
